ARIZONA INTRAMURALS PROGRAM MISSION

The Department of Campus Recreation Intramural Sports Program seeks to meet the needs and interests of the diverse campus population. We do this by providing games and activities for men's, women's, and co.-recreational play in an effort to create and maintain a relaxed and friendly play environment.

ARIZONA INTRAMURALS PROGRAM INTRODUCTION

Intramural sports are activities, which are designed so University of Arizona students, faculty and staff have the opportunity to exercise, develop lifetime interest in quality leisure activity, and develop an appreciation of cultural diversity through recreational play. This development doesn't stop at participation. It also includes employment opportunities, which help to develop work skills. Intramural leagues tournaments and special events are designed so that both the competitive and the recreational player can have an enjoyable experience during their participation. Participation is designed so that a sense of community is created during play. This is why "Everyone Wins When We Play Together".

For League Sports it's best to put a team together with people you know from classes, residence halls, campus organizations, etc. so that you can all have fun together. However, if you don't know many of your classmates yet, there is no better way of making friends than by joining an Intramural team. For Tournament Sports and Special Events, get ready to test your skills while socializing with others.

Participation in any Intramural activity is completely voluntary. Therefore it is strongly suggested that all participants undergo a physical examination prior to participating in any sports or activity. Each individual participating assumes the responsibility for his/her own health and insurance needs. The University of Arizona and the Department of Campus Recreation assumes no responsibility for insurance coverage or payment of property damage or medical bills incurred due to injury while participating.

Because of the unique variety of events, activities and functions that take place during the year on and off campus, it is impossible to factor in potential schedule conflicts when planning the Intramural Sports Calendar of events. Therefore social events, group functions, other department's activities, varsity or club competition, religious conviction/observances are not, and will not be considered when planning activities.

There is no place in recreation or athletic competitions for racial slurs, derogatory comments, homophobic comments, hate speech or behavior that is intimidating or threatening to anyone. These types of conduct are unacceptable and will not be tolerated. Please treat each other with respect and dignity.

The Intramural Sports Staff works for you. We are customer service oriented; however please realize that there must be customer responsibility. The Intramural Sports Staff reserves the right to act on any situation that may arise which is not specifically covered in sport specific rules, this material or any other Intramural Sports literature.

THE DEPARTMENT OF CAMPUS RECREATION MISSION

The Department of Campus Recreation provides programs; facilities and educational opportunities which seek to meet the diverse recreational, fitness and wellness needs of our students and community.

THE DEPARTMENT OF CAMPUS RECREATION VISION

We are a progressive, fiscally responsible department dedicated to excellent fitness, wellness and recreational services that contribute positively to our diverse university and global community.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Intramural Sports Advisory Committee is comprised of students from campus organizations who represent diverse aspects of campus life. When needed, the committee meets to discuss various topics related to maintaining and improving the Intramural Sports Program. The Intramural Sports Program is constantly seeking individuals to serve on this committee. Interested individuals should contact the Office.

ALCOHOL POLICY

The University of Arizona Alcohol Policy prohibits the possession or consumption of alcohol at university sponsored events held on university property except within limited areas approved by the Vice President for University Affairs. Possession or consumption of alcohol or illegal drugs is prohibited at any Department of Campus Recreation facility or program at ALL times. Additionally, if Intramural Sports Assistants and/or Officials suspect any individual of being under the influence, (even if the scent is on the persons clothing or body) that person will NOT be allowed to participate and will be asked to leave the facility. Each team is responsible for enforcing this policy with team members and spectators and if individuals create a problem when asked to leave, the contest will be forfeited. Violators are also subject to disciplinary action in accordance with University policy.

ASSUMPTION OF RISKS AND PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY

In consideration of the services of The University of Arizona Intramural Sports Program, The Arizona Board of Regents, their officers, agents, employee and all other persons or entities associated with it (collectively referred to as Intramural Sports Program), I agree as follows: Although the Intramural Sports Program has taken reasonable steps to provide me with appropriate equipment and skilled staff so I can enjoy this activity for which I may not be skilled, I acknowledge that this activity is not without risk. Certain risks cannot be eliminated without destroying the unique character of this activity. The same elements that contribute to the unique character of this activity can be causes of loss

or damage to my equipment, accidental injury, and illness or in extreme cases, permanent trauma or death. The Intramural Sports Program does not want to frighten me or reduce my enthusiasm for this activity, but thinks it is important for me to know in advance what to expect and to be informed of the inherent risks.

The following describes some, but not all, of those risks:

Intramural Sports activities take place both in and out of doors, where participants are subject to a variety of risks. Activities vary and include such actions as running, jumping, passing, kicking, catching, and physical contact with others during participation in “contact” and “non-contact” activities. Falling, slipping, sliding, tripping, bumps, bruises, cuts, abrasions, contusions, dislocations, broken bones, pulled muscles, fatigue and sunburn can potentially be a part of this participation.

I am aware that the Intramural Sports Program activities include risks of injury or death to teammates and me. I understand the description of these risks is not complete and that other unknown or unanticipated risks may result in property loss, injury or death. I agree to assume responsibility for the inherent risks identified herein and those inherent risks not specifically identified. My participation in this activity is purely voluntary, no one is forcing me to participate, and I elect to participate in spite of and with full knowledge of the inherent risks.

I acknowledge that engaging in this activity may require a degree of skill and knowledge different from other activities and that I have responsibilities as a participant. I acknowledge that the staff of the Intramural Sports Program has been available to more fully explain the nature and physical demands of this activity and inherent risks, hazards and dangers associated with this activity.

I have read and understand the information sheet and handbook provided by the Intramural Sports Program. I am aware of the level of exertion required to participate in this activity. I have the necessary skills as listed on the information sheet and handbook to participate. I have verified with my physician and other medical professionals that I have no past or current physical or psychological condition that might affect our participation in this activity, other than described on the Health Statement Form (if applicable). I authorize the Intramural Sports Program to obtain or provide emergency hospitalization, surgical or other medical care for me.

I understand that the laws of the State of Arizona govern this Assumption of Risk and Personal Responsibility. I certify that I am fully capable of participating in this activity, without causing harm to others or myself. Therefore, I, my parents or guardians if I am a minor, assume full responsibility for bodily injury, death and loss of personal property and expenses suffered by myself as a result of those inherent risks and dangers identified herein and those inherent risks and dangers not specifically identified, and as a result of our negligence in participating in this activity. I am responsible for reading the current Intramural Handbook and sports rules and agree that I will abide by all rules, policies and procedures. I also agree to pay any related fees or penalties associated with my team’s participation in this activity as outlined in the Intramural fee policy.

I acknowledge that racial epithets, anger motivated outburst, demeaning, degrading and derogatory remarks, homophobic comments or intimidating actions are unacceptable forms of behavior. I agree that I will not participate in said behavior during participation in Intramural Sports because it is contrary to The University of Arizona Standard of Civility as well as Intramural Sports policy. I also agree that any spectators associated with my participation in this activity and in attendance will be held to the same standard as participants.

I hereby grant full permission to record any or all of my participation in this activity for photos, motion pictures, TV, radio, recordings, video tape, e-mail, web page and other media known or unknown, and use them, no matter by who taken, in any manner for publicity, promotion, advertising, trade, or commercial purposes without any reimbursement of any kind due to you, or the need to pay you any fee.

I understand/acknowledge that all level Playoffs may be scheduled at anytime, seven days a week. I will be prepared to play.

I, and my parents or guardians if I am a minor, have read, understood and accept the terms and conditions stated herein and acknowledge that this agreement shall be effective and binding upon myself, my heirs, and personal representatives and estate and all members of my family.

ATTIRE (DURING PARTICIPATION)

Each participant must wear attire that can be both defined and described as athletic in nature. In sport specific cases, as defined by the rules or described by staff, the athletic attire must be “without pockets” of any kind, shape or form. Each team sport participant shall have a shirt of one distinguishable color with individual numbers permanently attached. Teams, players and participants will be penalized accordingly if they do not meet this requirement. Please see the “JEWELRY section for additional prohibitions.

BLOOD POLICY

If a participant is bleeding, he/she will be removed from the contest immediately. If a participant has blood on his/her clothing, he/she will be removed from the contest upon detection. The blood may or may not be his/her own blood. Even a participant who has someone else's blood on their clothing will be removed from the contest. The participant is ineligible to reenter the contest until the clothing saturated with blood has been removed. Before any participant re-enters the contest, all bleeding must be stopped and any open wound or laceration covered. The Intramural Sports Staff recommends that each player bring an extra uniform. If clothing saturated with blood cannot be replaced, that individual will not be allowed to participate.

CAPTAIN'S RESPONSIBILITIES

Intramural team captains serve as the communication link between their team and the Intramural Sports Program. They are responsible for understanding Intramural information and passing it on to team members. Duties include:

1. Pre-Season Duties:

- Select team name (we reserve the right to edit team names), division, day, and time the team wants to play.
- Pay the entry fee.
- Complete the League Sport Entry Form and submit it when you pay the entry fee.
- You are only allowed to be the captain for ONE TEAM per sport.
- You or the listed co.-captain must attend the League Meeting for each activity entered. Failure to be represented at the meeting will result in the assessment of a \$7 Missed Meeting Fee. If not in attendance pick up a copy of the league schedule and take the Intramural Policy Quiz as well as pick up any updated information in the Intramural Sports Office the following business day.
- You agree to read the Intramural Sports Handbook and the rules for your sport as well as ensuring that all team members understand and abide by them, especially player conduct and eligibility.
- Have each team member complete and submit an Assumption of Risk and Personal Responsibility Form.

2. In-Season Duties:

- Inform team members of play schedules to ensure enough members are present to avoid a forfeit.
- Check the Information Board at the Student Rec. Center at least once a week for current information.
- In case of forfeit, pay the \$20 re-entry fee within 48 hours so that the team may continue to play.
- Check to be sure that players print first, last name and Cat Card ID number on the game scorecard.
- Provide score keeper/timers in the sports required.
- Ensure that team has same color/numbered shirts in appropriate sports.
- Ensure that you, your team and spectators play within the spirit of the game.
- Ensure that you, your team and spectators comply with all rules, policies and procedures during participation.
- Ultimately you are responsible for the actions of the team. In all cases when an offending party on your team cannot be identified you will be held responsible and could face sanctions.
- One-team member's actions can be responsible for the entire team being ejected from a league.

3. General Duties:

- Control actions & accept responsibility for conduct of team members & fans.
- When an Unsportslike penalty cannot be assigned to a team member or spectator the captain shall receive the penalty.
- Maintain a cooperative attitude with all Officials and Staff while serving as an example of good sportsmanship for others to follow.
- Be familiar with the rules and officiating techniques of all sports that you participate in.
- Assist in the recruitment of officials.
- Accommodate players by inviting Free Agents to play.
- Serve as the "voice" for your team.

CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS

Champions at each level of play in their respective division will receive a T-shirt. There are restrictions on the number of T-shirt's that may be awarded to any one team. Please check the office to determine how many T-shirts will be allotted for a particular sport. When a sport has a sponsor the champions will receive a sponsor T-shirt.

Photos of each champion will be taken and placed on the Intramural Wall-of-Fame. Teams and individuals may purchase championship photos at a cost of \$2.00 per photo.

A team championship trophy may be awarded in selected league sports, if/when the trophy is provided by the sponsor. This trophy will be presented to sport champions when applicable.

CONDUCT - THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

There are two documents that establish the behavioral standards expected of all University of Arizona students: The 1983 Code of Conduct and the 2000 Student Code of Conduct. Complete copies are available in the Dean of Students Office, 203 Old Main. Students are prohibited from engaging in the following:

All forms of student academic dishonesty, including but not limited to cheating, fabrication, facilitating academic dishonesty, and plagiarism. Endangering, threatening, or causing physical harm to any member of the university community or to oneself or causing reasonable apprehension of such harm. Violating the terms of any disciplinary sanction imposed for an earlier violation of the Student Code of Conduct or other Board or university rules. Violation of, or attempt to violate, other published rules that may be adopted by the board or by the university.

Furnishing false information, including false identification, or failure to provide information to the university or to any university employee or agent, including campus law enforcement or security officers or other agents, acting in good faith.

Initiating, causing or contributing to any false report, warning or threat of fire, explosion or other emergency.

Failure to comply with the directions of university officials or agents, including law enforcement or security officers, acting in good faith and in the performance of their duties.

Forgery, falsification, unauthorized alteration, or misuse of campus documents, records, or identification, including, but not limited to, software and records.

Unauthorized presence in or unauthorized use of university property, resources, or facilities.

Unauthorized access to, disclosure of, or use of any university document, record, or identification, including but not limited to, electronic software, data, and records.

Interfering with university or university-sponsored activities, including but not limited to classroom related activities, studying, teaching, research, intellectual or creative endeavor, administration, service or the provision of communication, computing or emergency services.

Misrepresenting oneself or an organization as an agent of a university.

Possession of property the student know or has reason to believe may be stolen or misappropriated.

Misuse, theft, misappropriation, destruction, damage, or unauthorized use, access, or reproduction of property, data, records, equipment or services belonging to the university or belonging to another person or entity.

Violation of Board or university rules governing alcohol, including consumption, distribution, unauthorized sale or possession of alcoholic beverages.

Unauthorized use, sale, possession or distribution of any controlled substance or illegal drug or possession of drug paraphernalia that would violate the law.

Off-campus conduct involving sale or distribution of illegal drugs or controlled substances, or violence, which may present a danger to the safety of the university community.

Off-campus conduct related to gambling associated with any university event or activity.

Gambling as prohibited by law or applicable policy.

Engaging in, supporting, promoting, or sponsoring hazing or violating university rules governing hazing.

Engaging in harassment or repeated unwanted contact, including, but not limited to, stalking.

Engaging in discriminatory activities, whether unlawful or whether prohibited by university policy, on the basis of age, ethnicity, gender, disability, color, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation or veteran status.

Interfering with any university disciplinary process, including but not limited to tampering with physical evidence or inducing a witness to provide false information or to withhold information.

Engaging in any sexual offense, including but not limited to, sexual assault, public sexual indecency or indecent exposure.

Use, possession, display or storage of any weapon, dangerous instrument, explosive device, fireworks, or dangerous chemical unless specifically authorized by university officials.

Commission of any offense prohibited by state or federal law.

Any attempt to commit or conceal an act of misconduct prohibited by these rules is subject to sanctions to the same extent as completed acts.

CONDUCT OF PARTICIPANTS AND SPECTATORS

The program seeks to provide exercise, recreation, and fun to participants in a relaxed, yet structured environment. All actions and comments, whether directed to staff, opponents, teammates, or spectators should be constructive and conducive to fulfilling this purpose.

Please play to the best of your ability and make every effort to win within the spirit of the rules. Be advised that win-at-all cost attitudes are totally inappropriate and are strongly discouraged. All participants and spectators are expected to behave in a courteous and responsible manner in victory and in defeat. Intramural & Extramural Sports are valuable recreational activities but their value comes from the benefits of playing, not from winning.

These guidelines should assist teams in reinforcing a sportsmanlike atmosphere.

1. Expected Conduct

- Participants and spectators are expected to behave in a cooperative, positive manner, which contributes to the philosophy of friendly competition.
- Teams are responsible for the conduct of members & spectators before, during, and after any Intramural Sports or Extramural Sports contest.
- It is the responsibility of each team to cooperate with the Intramural Sports Staff in controlling both team members and spectators. The game will be forfeited if in the opinion of the Staff such cooperation is not evident.
- Participants and spectators are expected to comply with the requests and directives of all Intramural Sports personnel in a respectful pleasant manner.

2. Misconduct (Unsportslike Conduct)

- Team Captains, Managers or Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their players, and therefore are subject to the same disciplinary actions as their players.
- In cases where the responsible team member cannot be identified for Unsportslike behavior the TEAM CAPTAIN MAY BE ASSESSED the appropriate sanctions.
- Vulgar, obscene, abusive, derogatory, intimidating and demeaning comments or gestures will NOT be tolerated. Such comments and gestures create a hostile environment, generate ill will, place unnecessary pressure on players, and contribute to a negative Intramural Sports experience.
- All acts of physical aggression including fighting, pushing, shoving, kicking or any other attempt to injure another person, are totally unacceptable responses in any area of campus life especially Intramural Sports.
- Any comments, signs, jokes, remarks or gestures intended to threaten or intimidate any other person are forms of verbal aggression, which are equally inappropriate and will be disciplined accordingly.
- The minimum sanction for any individual involved in any act of physical/verbal aggression or physical contact of any type toward an Intramural Staff member may be a lifetime suspension from the program.

- The consumption or possession (or the scent is detected on your person) of any type of alcoholic beverage before, during or after a game is not allowed.
- Destroying, damaging, misappropriating or gaining unauthorized access to personal property
- The Unsportslike actions of one team member can cause a team to be disqualified from a league.
- Any team that forfeits a game due to misconduct will receive a loss for the next scheduled league or playoff game.

3. Spectators

- The role of spectators is to provide support and encouragement, which will be beneficial to the participants, the game and the program.
- Spectators must remain in designated areas and not encroach on the playing area.
- Spectators violating these guidelines or exhibiting Unsportslike conduct will be asked to leave and may be assessed additional sanctions.
- Team Captains and or teams can be penalized for the actions of their spectators.

CONDUCT DURING EXTRAMURAL TOURNAMENTS

Teams or individuals that represent the university in Extramural Tournaments will be held to the same standard of conduct previously stated in the Conduct of Participants and Spectators section of this handbook. Sanctions in addition to those assessed at the extramural tournament may be imposed. A participant with ejected status or serving a suspension CAN NOT PARTICIPATE in Extramural events such as State, Regional or National Tournaments.

CONDUCT SPORTSMANSHIP POINTS

Sportsmanship points are a reflection of the team's attitude before, during and after an Intramural Sports event. This system is meant to develop a positive atmosphere of fun and fair play, to provide an opportunity for meaningful participant interaction and to encourage teams to be more responsible for the behavior of their players/spectators. Assessment of Sportsmanship Points begins when a team or player takes the court/field. The assessment period ends when a team or player leaves the facility. The following explains this system.

Each team will automatically have 50 Sportsmanship Points to start the season. Sportsmanship infractions are assigned a point value. That value is deducted from teams 50 points after an infraction occurs. A team is DROPPED from the league and or play-offs if it drops to "0" points (a team can not play at "0" points).

There is "NO" appeal for Sportsmanship infractions. The penalties are severe but are justified for unacceptable behavior.

A. 10 Point Deductions:

- Players/Teams/Spectators being assessed Unsportslike conduct penalties, technical fouls or yellow cards.
- An individuals or team expressing visual or verbal dissent to opposing team.
- Team/individuals who gain illegal entry to a facility prior to the playtime.

B. 15 Point Deductions:

- Players or team persistently argues the official's judgment during the game.
- A team forfeits a game. \$20.00 Re-Entry Fee still applies.
- A team uses an ineligible player.
- Players/Team/Spectators do not comply with the request of a staff person.

C. 20 Point Deductions:

- A player is ejected from a game.
- A team, player or spectator involved in a physical altercation.
- A team/player persists with rough play after being issued an Unsportslike conduct penalty.
- A player, team or spectator uses abusive language or gestures toward a participant or staff person.

D. 30 Point Deductions:

- Team, player or spectator makes intimidating physical contact with a staff.
- A team, player or spectator threatens harm or violence toward the staff.

- Players/Team/Spectators use racial epithets, anger motivated outburst, demeaning, degrading and derogatory statements or homophobic comments before, during or after a game.
- A team forfeits a game due to team/fan misconduct (also receives automatic loss for their next scheduled league or playoff game).
- A team/Player/Coach leaves the bench area for any reason to participate in an altercation. The team also receives an automatic loss for their next league or playoff game.
- Players/Team/Spectators vandalize equipment, the facility or property.

ADDITIONAL PENALTIES:

- Any team receiving a “30 point” misconduct deduction may be subject to other forms of disciplinary action as deemed necessary by the Intramural Sports Staff and the Department Judicial Board.
- A team may also forfeit a game due to team misconduct if that team is unable to control its members and/or fans to the extent that the game cannot be completed.
- A team may also be subject to other forms of disciplinary actions as deemed necessary by the Intramural Sports Staff and the Department Judicial Board.
- Each team is responsible for checking their sportsmanship points AFTER EACH GAME.
- Failure to sign the scorecard forfeits your right to question.
- In instances where different sportsmanship points are listed, the master book in the Office will be used as the official record.
- In instances where multiple infractions occur ALL shall count.
- Referral to the Dean of Student Office

CONDUCT PROCESS (JUDICIAL SYSTEM)

The Department of Campus Recreation Conduct System makes every attempt to respond in an educational nature when dealing with issues that are contrary to positive recreational interaction. Its primary purpose is to provide “teachable moments” for participants who choose to act in an inappropriate manner. This system exists to protect the rights of all individuals who elect to participate in the programs offered by the department.

While it is not a legal system governed by specific legal rules and procedures, it does provide due process and other requirements that balance the rights of individuals with the rights of the community. As an administrative rather than legal process, the burden of proof is less precise than in the courts. Conduct decisions are based on preponderance of evidence and not upon guilt beyond a shadow of doubt. This process is designed to respond effectively and efficiently to conduct issues in a timely manner.

This system addresses conduct issues governed by the agreement between participants and Intramural Sports. This typically means that what occurs during participation may be dealt with through the Department of Campus Recreation conduct system and go no further. However, conduct issues that also violate the University Student Code of Conduct will be referred to the Dean of Students Office for University action. Likewise, violations of the law will be referred to UAPD for action and possible prosecution. This “judicial process” applies to patrons, participants and users of all campus recreation programs, facilities and services.

The process is initiated when any person or team commits, attempts to commit, incites or aids others in committing acts of misconduct, violation of community standards, policy or law and the act is brought to the attention of a Department Staff Member. The Staff Member will investigate and, depending on the situation does one or more of the following:

- Issue a verbal warning and advise the participant that recurrence will result in further action.
- Complete an Incident Report Form and submit it to the Director of the Program.
- Eject the participant(s) and complete an Ejection Form.
- Ejected individuals are immediately suspended from all Intramural Sports competition.
- Individuals ejected from Intramural contest shall also forfeit the right to enter or recreate in any Department of Campus Recreation facility or program.
- NOTE: Individuals ejected from other Department of Campus Recreation Programs also forfeit the right to enter or recreate in any Department of Campus Recreation facility, program, extramural or special event.
- Ejected individuals MUST submit a written explanation/request for reinstatement with 14 days of being ejected to the Judicial Board. The ejected individual can then meet with the Department of Campus Recreation Judicial Board to determine eligibility or further penalties. The Board meets every Friday from 3:00 P.M. - 4:00 P.M. (first come, first serve)

- Staff has the authority to assess Unsportslike sanctions at any time before, during, or after an event.
- Persons ejected from an Intramural game for any reason may receive an AUTOMATIC suspension for the next game. Ejected participants names are placed on the Ejected Participants list, which is available upon request to, listed Captains.
- Any questions about a participant's status should be directed to the Intramural Sports office.
- Sanctions or penalties are not imposed until after the ejected person meets with the Department Judicial Board. Self-imposed sanctions will not be considered.
- If an ejected participant elects not to meet with the board then a decision will be made in absentia, after the 14 day period

DEFAULT POLICY

Defaults:

1. For League Sports:

- As a courtesy to their opponents and to avoid a forfeit, a team may request to receive default for any game they will be unable to attend. In order to do so they must notify the Intramural Sports Office at 621-8723 during normal business hours at least 24 hours prior to that game (Sunday games notification deadline is Friday at 3:30 P.M.).
- Default is recorded as a loss but does not require a fee payment.

2. For Tournament Sports and Special Events:

- If a participant fails to appear within 10 minutes after the scheduled time, the contest will be forfeited. The forfeit must be reported to, and verified by, the Intramural Sports Staff. A participant will be dropped from the tournament once a forfeit is declared.

DISABILITIES (Person's With Disabilities)

Persons with disabilities may request a reasonable accommodation by contacting the Intramural Sports Program at 621-8723. Please ask for the Assistant Director, Intramural Coordinator, Graduate Assistant or Student Program Coordinator for Intramural Sports. Request should be made as early as possible to allow time to arrange the accommodation.

EJECTED PARTICIPANTS (also see Judicial Board)

ALL EJECTED PARTICIPANTS

You are not allowed to participate in any Campus Recreation activities. You are not allowed to enter Campus Recreation Facilities! Please complete the following steps to regain eligibility.

Write a letter to the judicial board petitioning reinstatement. The letter should include the following:

- The ejected person's name
- The ejected person's email address
- The ejected person's local mailing address
- The ejected person's Cat Card Number
- The sport, facility, program or activity that the person was ejected from.
- The ejected person's version of "what happened".
- Why the ejected person should be reinstated.

Submit the letter to: Campus Recreation Business Office, 2nd floor of the Student Recreation Center: ATTN: Judicial Board

EJECTED PARTICIPANT – OTHER RELATED INFORMATION:

- Ejected individuals MUST submit a written explanation/request for reinstatement with 14 days of being ejected to the Judicial Board.
- The letter must be submitted at least 24 hours prior to meeting (no later than the close of business on Thursday).
- The Judicial Board meets on Friday during the Fall/Spring semester from 3:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m.
- The Judicial Board meets on Friday during the "Summer" on an as needed basis.
- If an ejected participant elects not to meet with the board then a decision will be made in absentia, after the 14 day period
- For questions call Arizona Intramural Sports at 621-8723.
- All team captains are responsible for knowing the eligibility status of their players!

ELIGIBILITY

The Intramural Sports Staff cannot be solely responsible for checking the eligibility of each person who participates in Intramural Sports. Therefore each person is responsible for meeting eligibility requirements. Each team captain and each participant is responsible for verifying the eligibility of their team and individuals. Always remember to check the Ejected Participants List at the Intramural Sports Office. Questionable cases should be referred to the Intramural Sports Staff for a ruling prior to playing. Whenever a specific case is reported, an inquiry will be made to determine the eligibility of that player.

ELIGIBILITY - WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN ARIZONA INTRAMURALS

All University of Arizona students currently enrolled with 1 or more units.

University of Arizona students solely taking correspondence courses are eligible to participate provided they purchase a Department of Campus Recreation Membership and provide proof of CURRENT enrollment.

- University of Arizona Faculty/Staff with a current Cat Card.
- University of Arizona Faculty/Staff with a Department of Campus Recreation Membership
- University of Arizona Faculty/Staff with a \$20 Intramural Participation Card. A card must be purchased for each sport participated in. (ONLY Faculty/Staff are eligible to purchase Intramural Participation Cards)
- Alumni who are Department of Campus Recreation "Gold Card" Members.

ELIGIBILITY - OTHER RELATED INFORMATION

Intramural participants MUST show their current University Cat Card, or Intramural Participation Card with additional photo ID to the Intramural Staff before every game or they will be ineligible to play in that game.

- Participants may only play on one men/women's team and one co.-rec. team in the same sport in a season.
- If a comparable participation opportunity is not available for women's team/participant at a specific level of play then that team or participant will be allowed to participate in men's league or on a men's team. All such exceptions must be verified "in writing" directly through the Intramural Sports Office prior to participation taking place.
- After playing in one game with any team (players name appears on the individual game roster), a player may not transfer to another team in that sport.
- An individual who plays for more than one team (players name appears on the individual game roster) in a single sport may NOT be allowed to continue to play in that sport for the remainder of the season.
- A team participating with an ineligible player will be subject to the forfeiture of all games that player participated in.
- Individuals who play under an assumed name may be suspended for one year and the player's team may be dropped from the league without entry fee refund.
- The Intramural Sports Staff reserves the right to declare ANY team or individual ineligible for further participation due to inappropriate behavior or Unsportslike conduct.
- Members of intercollegiate teams (4 year, junior or community college) are ineligible to participate in their respective sport or related sport. An individual is considered a member of an intercollegiate squad if he/she has competed in the sport, is "red shirting" in the sport, is practicing with the team, is listed on the coach's roster for that sport, or is receiving any benefits associated with being an intercollegiate athlete in that sport.
- If a player is "red shirting", practicing with the team or just listed on the coaches roster for that sport the player may request an exemption to this rule by submitting a request to the Assistant Director.
- Former intercollegiate athletes are eligible to participate in their sport (in the Cactus Division only) provided 12 months have elapsed since their status as an intercollegiate athlete has ended. The Intramural Sports Program reserves the right to limit the number of such players on a given team.
- Sport Club members who participate in Intramural Sports activities in their respective sport are restricted to:
 - TWO (2) Club Members per Cactus level team
 - ONE (1) Club Member per Sunset or Desert level team
- An individual is considered a Sport Club member if he/she is listed on the official roster of that sport, practices with the club, or competes in club or competition. Sport club member's status encompasses an academic year.
- Professional and Semi-Professional Athletes (individuals who compete for financial remuneration through goods or services) are ineligible to participate in their sport or related activity.

- Former professional athletes are eligible to participate in the Cactus Division of their sport provided 36 months have elapsed since their status as a professional ended. Teams are restricted to one such participant.
- Ineligible players may not participate even with the mutual agreement of both teams.
- An individual must play in one league game to be eligible for the playoffs.
- The Program reserves the right to verify eligibility at ANY time.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

1. League Sports:

- All League Sports are "Instant Scheduled" which means that teams choose the level of play and the day and time most convenient for them to play.
- Leagues are filled on a first-come-first-served basis (teams should have second and third choices ready). EXCEPT for play-offs, league games will be played on the day/time selected. For league sports each team will play a league game schedule. Teams normally play once a week.
- All teams will advance to a play-off. Play-offs may take place any day or time.
- Spots are reserved by submitting a team name (we reserve the right to change/modify inappropriate names), an entry form, picking up a sports packet and paying the entry fee. Entries are accepted weekdays Noon – 3:30 P.M. during the entry period. (Entries after the deadline will be assessed a \$7 Late Fee.)
- The listed captain or co.-captain must be present at the League Meeting (with picture ID). ID will be checked to verify attendance. A person may represent only one team, regardless of sport, division or level of play.

2. Tournament Sports and Special Events:

- Complete and return the Entry Form. Specify activity, event, and level.
- Brackets are usually posted the Friday before the tournament begins.
- Tournament Sports & Special Events are normally one day or weekend tournament activities.
- Teams/ Participants will play a double elimination format. Be prepared to play all day.

3. Wait List Teams:

- Wait List teams will be placed solely on league and time availability.
- All wait list teams will be placed in a league at their level only if a spot is open in an existing league.
- If there is no spot available teams will be placed in an OPEN LEAGUE in their division, which will be comprised of all levels. Refund status begins when the team is placed.

ENTRY PROCEDURES — OTHER RELATED INFORMATION

- Please keep both "RECEIPTS" that you receive after you make payment. This is proof of payment incase a refund is requested.

ENTRY FEES

All fees (\$\$) are used to pay student employees, provide awards, promote/publicize activities, and purchase equipment. These fees do not cover the entire costs for the program, but do help to offset these expenses. This program does not receive any University of Arizona student fee monies. When considering the quality of the program and the positive experiences enjoyed by the participants, the program remains a tremendous value. When a league, tournament sport or special event is officially canceled, a 100% refund will be given. Regional and National Championship Tournament entry fees vary. Please check the sports specific information sheet.

- Officiated League Sports are \$65.00 team.
- Non-Officiated League Sports are \$35.00 per team.
- Tournaments/Special Events are \$2.00 - \$14.00 per person/team. Please check the sport specific information sheet to get the correct entry fee.
- Game Rescheduling fee is \$10.00.
- Missed League Meeting fee is \$7.00.
- League Late Entry fee is \$7.00.
- Refund status begins when you enter a sport or activity.
- League Re-Entry fee is \$20.00.
- Equipment Rental fees vary. Call for specific cost.
- Cancellation Fee for all Waitlist Teams that decline to play after being placed is 10%.
- Faculty/Staff Participation Cards are \$20.00

FACILITY REGULATIONS

1. Indoor facilities:

- University Cat Card ID is required.
- Enter and exit at proper points.
- Observe all posted rules.
- Comply with the request of Department of Campus Recreation Employees.
- No spitting on any gymnasium floors.
- No shoes, no shirt, no service!
- No foods, drinks, gum, alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs.
- No practicing, dribbling, or playing catch in hallways, offices, lounges, etc.
- No grabbing/holding or popping the basketball rims or supports.
- No animals (exception: assistance for disabled).
- No firearms, knives or weapons of any kind.
- Place all trash in proper containers.
- Posting of signs, fliers or posters is prohibited without proper authorization.
- Exit facility when alarms sound.

2. Outdoor activities:

- Enter and exit facilities at proper points.
- Observe all posted rules.
- Comply with request of all Department of Campus Recreation employees.
- No glass containers or glass products.
- No bikes or motor vehicles are allowed on any grass areas within the fence.
- No alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs.
- No animals. (Exception: assistance for disabled)
- Place all trash in containers.
- No "jumping" the fence. Remain outside the facility until a Staff member arrives on site.
- No firearms, knives or weapons of any kind.

FORFEIT POLICY

The Intramural Sports Program is designed to relieve stress by providing an environment, which promotes fun and exercise away from the pressures of the classroom. If a team or individual fails to show up for their game, they have deprived themselves and the other participants of that opportunity.

Follow the listed guidelines:

1. For League Sports:

- If a team does not have the minimum number of players to start a contest at the scheduled time, they will be given 10 minutes to secure the correct number before the game is declared a forfeit.
- The Sports Assistant will declare a forfeit and award a “win” to the team that is ready to play with the correct number of players after they have properly entered their team on the scorecard.
- If neither team is ready to play with the minimum number of players after the 10-minute forfeit period then both teams will receive a forfeit.
- A team that does not have the minimum number of players at the end of the 10-minute forfeit period shall forfeit the game. Example: game time is at 6:00 P.M.; the game will be declared a forfeit at 6:10 P.M. In all cases the game must remain within the time period allotted, this means that the game clock will start at the time the game is scheduled to be played so that the 10 minutes will be deducted from normal playing time.
- A team must start and continue the game with the minimum number of players as stated in the rules for that sport or a forfeit will be declared.
- A team may receive a forfeit due to improper team attire.
- Teams found to have ineligible players in the game or on the game roster may forfeit that game, depending upon time of discovery and the player’s effect on the game’s outcome.
- Any Intramural Sports Staff may assess forfeits for the use of an ineligible player or for player/spectator misconduct.
- Forfeited games will not be rescheduled.
- If a team forfeits ONCE the first team on the waiting list may replace it (without a refund). If there is no waiting list, the team may continue to play by paying a \$20.00 Re-Entry Fee at the Intramural Sports Office within 48 hours of the forfeit.
- If a team forfeits or defaults twice (in league) it is dropped without notice.
- A contest completed prior to a team being dropped from the league is official. A contest not played is recorded as a “win” for the opposing team.
- A team will receive a forfeit if a game cannot be continued due to misconduct. The team will also be assessed the re-entry fee.

FORFEIT PENALTIES

IF A TEAM ARRIVES DURING THE 10-MINUTE FORFEIT PERIOD THEY WILL BE ALLOWED TO PLAY, BUT WILL BE ASSESSED THE FOLLOWING PENALTIES:

FLAG FOOTBALL

- Lose the right to protest the game
- Lose the option with regard to the coin toss
- Start the game with an 8 point deficit

SOFTBALL

- Lose the right to protest the game
- Will be visitors on the scorecard
- Start the game with a 4 run deficit
- **These rules also apply to Co-Rec. Softball**

BASKETBALL

- Lose the right to protest the game
- All possession in a jump ball situation go to
- The opposing team (entire game)
- The opposing team is awarded 2 points for each minute into the forfeit time. (10 minutes equals 20 points)

SOCCKER

- Lose the right to protest the game
- All choices will go the opposing team
- Start the game with a 1 goal deficit
- *** These rules also apply to Speed Soccer**

6 on 6 VOLLEYBALL

- Lose the right to protest the game
- Opposing team gets first serve each game
- Start the first game with an 8 point deficit

* **These rules also apply to 3 on 3 Volleyball**

FLOOR HOCKEY

- Lose the right to protest the game
- Lose the option with regard to the coin flip
- Start the game with a 3 goal deficit

3 ON 3 BASKETBALL

- Lose the right to protest the game.
- Opposing team gets first possession of each game.
- Start the first game with an 8-point deficit.

TEAM TENNIS

- Lose the right to protest the match
- Opposing team gets first service each game
- Start the first set with an 8 point deficit

ULTIMATE FRISBEE

- Lose the right to protest the game
- Lose the right with regard to the coin flip
- Start the game with a 3 goal deficit

INNER TUBE WATERPOLO

- Lose the right to protest the game
- Lose the first possession option (the other team will start with possession of the ball.
- Start the game with a 2 goal deficit

FREE AGENTS (PLAYERS WITHOUT TEAMS)

Individuals who want to play league sports but are unable to form a team can still easily be involved. They should come to the Intramural Sports Office, or call 621-8723 and sign-up on the Free Agent List for the sport of interest. This list will be available for captains who are looking to add extra players to their teams.

Free Agents should then come to the Free Agent Play Days, which are offered for most league sports (please refer to the current Intramural Sports Calendar for dates and times). At these play days, players without teams are able to play together to find others interested in the sport at the same level as themselves. These individuals are then able to form a team and enter a league.

Most free agents are able to find a team through the above methods. However, those few who are not able to form or join a team should attend the League Meeting in order to meet captains. They should also attend early season games so they can be added to a team and play immediately if needed. Players without teams deserve the chance to make new friends while playing a sport they enjoy. Team captains are urged and encouraged to use Free Agents.

HEALTH/SAFETY/INSURANCE/MEDICAL EXAMS

The Intramural Sports Program includes activities, which can be physically demanding, and that have the potential for injury. Therefore, it is **STRONGLY** suggested that all participants undergo a routine physical exam prior to playing. Individuals, who have had previous injuries which may recur, or who are not physically suited for an activity, are urged to reconsider their participation for their own safety.

All injuries, regardless of severity, should be immediately reported to the official and on-site Sports Assistant. Each individual participating in Intramural Sports activities assumes the responsibility for his/her own health and insurance needs.

* **NOTE:** The Intramural Sports Program reserves the right to stop any participant from re-entering a game if that participant is hurt, injured or involved in an injury situation.

The Department of Campus Recreation assumes **NO** responsibility for insurance coverage or payment of medical bills incurred due to injury while participating in intramural activities. It is strongly recommended that every participant be certain he/she have some form of insurance (student, accident, Blue Cross, etc.) which will cover claims resulting from accidental injury during participation in Intramural activities.

Precautions are taken to make play is as safe as possible. These include rule modifications, staff training, inspection of facilities, etc. Medical Alert Bracelets/Chains are allowed (taped down).

As stated before it is strongly recommended that all participants have a physical exam prior to participation in an activity. The University of Arizona Campus Health Service has sports medicine doctors that can provide this service. Set up an appointment by calling 621-6490.

The University of Arizona Intramural Sports Program will not assume responsibility for any personal injuries or damage to personal property incurred during Intramural Sports participation.

ID POLICY (YOUR CAT CARD)

Why must a participant have an ID for each and every game? This is an often-asked question during the early part of the activity season. The answer is quite simple. During any and all transactions with the university your Student ID officially recognizes you. This is what defines your status as a member of the student body or the campus community.

Arizona Intramurals wants to provide the very best services to “OUR” participants. If outside people participate in the program they are putting participants and the university at risk. The other reason is, if an outside person were allowed to participate, these ineligible individuals would be, in essence, taking the opportunity to participate away from an eligible participant who we are here to serve.

Before each game players must present their Cat Card ID so that they may be signed in on the scorecard. Only the names of those players present will be placed on the game score card. Any player arriving after that game has started must present their Cat Card ID to the game official and have their name added to the game score card before entering the game. **NO ID, NO PLAY, NO EXCEPTIONS!**

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Rain Outs, Lightening, Snow, Monsoons, Standing Water, Thunder:

- Never assume that a game will be canceled merely because of rain. The Campus Recreation Staff has the sole responsibility for postponements in case of inclement weather.
- The factors, which will be considered are, field conditions, weather conditions, and participant safety.
- The listed Team Captain and/or Co. Captain will be called in the event that a game is cancelled due to inclement weather.
- You may call the Intramural Sports Office at 621-8723 or The Department of Campus Recreation at 621-4709 an hour before game time for postponement information.
- If games are postponed, the Intramural Sports Staff will reschedule them for alternate days and times (most often on Saturday or as doubleheaders). CAPTAINS are responsible for contacting the Intramural Sports Staff to confirm make-up days and times. If a team is unable to play on the makeup day, the game will be considered “no contest”.
- Unfortunately there is no guarantee that all postponed league games will be played. If the Intramural Sports Program elects not to make up rainouts, then all teams involved will receive a win. In no case will a partial refund be provided. The benefit that teams receive is the win.
- Rainout games will be considered official if they are stopped at halftime or later for soccer and flag football, at the end of the fourth inning or later for softball, and if a team has eight points or more for ultimate.
- During the week (Monday-Thursday) the decision to postpone games will not be made until 2:00p.m. During the weekend (typically Sunday) the decision to postpone will be made on site.

JEWELRY

In an effort to maintain the safest environment possible please abide by the following:

- All rings, necklaces, studs, and watches, bracelets etc. must be removed prior to playing.
- Glasses should be secured with a guard strap.
- Medical bracelets or chains are allowed.
- All braces with metal/hard plastic must be wrapped.
- Individuals wearing casts are not allowed to play.
- ALL body piercing must be removed prior to playing.
- In certain sports hats cannot be worn during the game.

THE JOE RUBIN MEMORIAL AWARD

The Department of Campus Recreation, Intramural Sports Program annually presents the Joe Rubin Memorial Award, given each year to the outstanding Intramural Sports participant. Joe, who was very active in the program of Intramural Sports, was killed in a car accident in

October of 1986. In his memory, Joe's family and friends created this award as well as a Graduate Assistant position to work within the Intramural Sports Program.

JUDICIAL BOARD

The Judicial Board is empowered to make decisions about the status of "ejected participants" if that participant appeals the decision of the Director of Judicial Affairs for the department. The Judicial Board typically includes students from various areas of the campus community who embody diverse aspects of campus recreation.

The Board meets every Friday during the academic year on an as needed basis, in the Student Recreation Center Conference Room. The Judicial Board:

- Reviews the process and the participant's rights.
- Reviews the incident, provide the participant(s) an opportunity to discuss the alleged violation(s) and provide an opportunity to accept or deny responsibility.
- Hears any pertinent testimony or views written statements.
- Determines if the ejection was warranted and then determines what is "Just" & "Fair" for individuals/teams that stray outside the bounds of good sportsmanship.

The Judicial Board reserves the right to create/enforce penalties that may not be specifically covered by the sport rules, this material or any other Intramural Sports/Department literature. Listed below are certain sanctions. If an ejected participant elects not to meet with the board then a decision will be made in absentia, after the 14 day period

- Player/Spectator makes racial slurs, derogator comments, homophobic comments, hate speech or behavior that is intimidating or threatening Ten week suspension

- Player/Spectator makes physical contact in a threatening manner (battery) toward a Staff Member Life time suspension

ADDITIONAL SANCTIONS ASSESSED INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- Suspension/forfeiture for a specific number of games.
- Suspension for the balance of the activity season.
- Suspension for the remainder of the semester.
- Suspension for a calendar year.
- Suspension for the remainder of the person's stay at U of A.
- Meet with the Assistant Director of Intramural Sports for other sanctions.
- Referral to the Dean of Students Office for possible action.
- Referral to the UAPD for possible action.

Any participant ejected for a third time in one school year shall receive an automatic one-year suspension beginning the date of the last ejection. This suspension applies to all campus recreation programs, activities, facilities, events and services. Participation in anything prior to meeting with the Board will be looked upon as a blatant disregard of policies and will be considered when rendering any sanctions.

Participants may appeal a conduct decision for which there is a sanction imposed. Request for appeals must be submitted by the close of business on the next scheduled University workday following the boards' decision. In most cases, an Appeal Hearing will be scheduled within the three days following receipt of the Request for Appeal. The request for appeal must assert and explain the Appellant's specific and substantive grounds for appeal. Possible appeals include:

- New Evidence, which would reasonably, affect the Boards decision.
- The Board erred in the interpretation of a policy.
- Illegal discrimination or prejudice influenced the Boards decision.
- The decision is not supported by the preponderance of the evidence.
- The sanction is overly severe or arbitrary.

Typically the Associate Director will hear appeals. The appeal must be made in writing directly to the Associate Director. The appeal must be made no later than the close of business on the first business day after receiving the Judicial Boards decision.

The Appeal Hearing is held to accomplish the following:

- Summarize the grounds upon which the Appellant seeks appeal.
- Provide the Appellant the opportunity to substantiate the grounds for appeal with credible evidence.
- Permit the Appeal Officer to question the Appellant, review statements, etc.
- Decide the appeal based on the merits of the grounds for appeal. Possible appeal decisions:
- Uphold the original decision and/or sanctions.
- Overturn the original decision and/or sanctions
- Amend the original decision and/or sanctions.

There is no further appeal option except when the sanction includes "Life Time Suspension" from the Department of Campus Recreation. Suspension appeals must be submitted to the Director of Campus Recreation by the close of business on the next scheduled University workday following the Appeal Hearing. All appeal requirements remain the same. Decisions of the Director or his/her designee are final.

CONDUCT PROCEEDINGS NOTES:

The participant(s) has the right to:

- Timely clarification of all policies, procedures and department standards.
- Review documentation being used.
- Participate fully in the hearing by presenting evidence, witnesses or questions.
- Be treated with respect and dignity at all times.
- A fair and impartial hearing.
- Confidential treatment of proceedings and outcomes by department staff.
- Notification and explanation of decisions.
- The option to appeal a decision or sanction.

OTHER NOTES:

- You may bring an Advisor.
- Hearings may be audio taped with advance permission of all persons present.
- The board may exclude irrelevant testimony or evidence.
- Dishonesty during the hearing violates U of A Community Standards. This dishonesty will be taken into consideration when rendering a decision.
- Participants with disabilities will be accorded reasonable accommodation in order that they may participate fully in the conduct process.
- Ignorance of Community Standards, policy, procedures, rules, obligations and or the law is not a valid defense in conduct proceedings.
- Notice of the participant(s) name; conduct violation and the results of the boards decision will be made public?
- Participants or teams removed, ejected or suspended for reasons of conduct are still financially responsible per there signed agreement.
- There is no refund for participants/teams ejected for conduct related issues.

LEAGUE MEETING

The listed team captain or co.-captain representing each team must be present (with picture ID) at the MANDATORY league meeting. Captains or co.-captains may only represent one team (role will be taken). Failure to attend will result in a \$7 Missed Meeting Fee being assessed and the captain taking a Policy Quiz. At this meeting, specifics of the sport will be discussed; rules explained schedules resolved Free Agents organized and team schedules distributed. Any team not attending the meeting must take an Intramural Policy Quiz and pick-up their schedule the following business day in the Intramural Sports Office. Please refer to the Intramural Calendar for meeting dates.

LEVELS OF PLAY

In an effort to meet the needs of a more varied recreational population, the Intramural Sports Program offers a tiered Intramural Sports structure. The three levels are divided based on intensity of competition and motivation for playing. This will enable participants to play in the most appropriate division. All Intramural activities are classified as recreational sports in the sense that they are less competitive and more cooperative than interscholastic or intercollegiate athletics. The primary reasons for playing Intramural Sports should always be relaxation, exercise, social interaction, and friendly competition. It is within this framework of competing with, rather than against, an opponent that the following levels of play were developed.

- **Desert (Newly Acquired Skills): The emphasis is on playing. “HAVING FUN”**
- **Sunset (Moderately Skilled): You are invested in determining a champion. “PLAYING HARD”**
- **Cactus (Highly Skilled): The most intense division. “WINNING BIG”**

LOST AND FOUND

Items or ID's that are lost at an Intramural Sports activity can be turned in to the on site Sport Assistant. These items may be claimed at the Department of Campus Recreation Pro-Shop during normal business hours on the following day. ID's not claimed are immediately taken to the University Student ID Center (Cat Card Office). Any other items not claimed normally within two weeks will be given to a local charitable organization.

The Program is always looking for enthusiastic and dedicated students to serve as Officials. Officials earn \$5.50 - \$6.00 per hour/game and must attend all training clinics and meetings. Previous experience is not required, but a positive attitude is.

Applicants should bring the following: a valid Drivers License or a Cat Card ID and your Social Security Card, Passport or Certified Birth Certificate. This information is needed to complete the application and payroll process. Stop by the Intramural Sports Office, in the Student Recreation Center or call 621-8723 and ask for the Coordinator of the sport that you are interested in officiating. So if you like sports and enjoy a challenge, please consider becoming a part of the Arizona Intramural Sports Program as a SPORTS OFFICIAL.

Officials in each sport go through an extensive training program. Training includes classroom sessions and on-site clinics. In the classroom, sports rules and officiating techniques are discussed and reviewed. The clinics consist of veteran officials demonstrating proper court/field coverage. Also, a number of practice games are scheduled for new officials to work. In several sports, training also includes officiating in a preseason tournament.

Your responsibilities as an official are to provide a good attitude toward fellow employees, participants and spectators. Work hard and hustle. Have knowledge of rules, regulations, policies and procedures. Attend clinics and meetings. Suggest new ideas to improve the program. Officiate every game to the best of your ability. If you like sports and like a challenge, please consider becoming a part of The University of Arizona, Department of Campus Recreation, and Intramural Sports Program. NOTE: Please See the Officials Introduction Meeting dates and times in the Intramural Office.

Participants and spectators are expected to treat the officials with respect and dignity. Individuals must understand that officials are a vital part of the program. They are human and they will make mistakes. But considering the nature of competition and the difficulty of officiating one's peers, they do an excellent job in controlling the game as fairly and consistently as possible. Everyone is urged to behave in a cooperative, considerate, and mature manner in all dealings with the officials. Individuals who are unable to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner will face disciplinary action.

- Place the welfare of the individual athlete above all other considerations.
- Maintain confidence and control from start of an assignment to finish.
- Devote time, thought and study to the rules of the game and the mechanics necessary to carry out these rules so that one may render effective/creditable service in a fair and unbiased manner.
- Work with fellow officials in a spirit of harmony and cooperation.
- Resist every temptation/pressure to use one's position as an official to benefit oneself.
- Under all circumstances avoid promoting the special interest of any person or group of persons other than the athletes we serve.
- Constantly uphold the honor and dignity of the avocation in all conduct and relations with the student athletes, coaches, athletic directors, school administrators, colleagues, and the public and to be a worthy example to the athletes under one's jurisdiction.
- Be prepared both physically and mentally, dress according to expectations, and maintain a proper appearance that is befitting the importance of the contest. Remember/Recognize it is important to honor contracts regardless of inconvenience or financial loss.

- Not smoke or use any form of tobacco in the vicinity of the playing area, nor drink alcoholic beverages or use drugs.
- Carry a responsibility to act in a manner becoming to a professional person. The conduct of any official influences the attitudes of the public toward the profession in general as well as toward the official in particular.

PARKING

Parking on The University of Arizona campus is limited and in great demand. While the University does all it can to provide adequate parking, limited space, increasing enrollment and new facility construction often make parking difficult. These rules are promulgated primarily to ensure an orderly and fair allocation and use of available space. The rules are not punitive but regulatory and should be interpreted fairly and to effectuate. The over-all intent to provide parking that is orderly, fair and convenient to all within the limits of available space and facilities.

The University of Arizona Parking and Traffic Regulations are enforced year-round and not just when classes are in official session. Permit requirements are waved on official University holidays. Spring Break is not considered a University holiday. A valid parking permit or pass is required to park on The University of Arizona campus during restricted hours. Signs located at the entrance to campus parking areas indicate the type of permit required, the hours of control and special regulations. In paved parking lots, motor vehicles shall park only in marked parking spaces. Parking spaces are marked by two white lines for vehicles, and motorcycles. In gravel or dirt parking areas, vehicles shall be parked perpendicular to the concrete wheel stop or bumper block.

The responsibility of finding a legal parking space rests with the vehicle operator. A parking permit does not guarantee a parking space; however, it does grant the privilege to park in the designated area when valid parking is available. Inability to find a space is not a license to violate these regulations. Use of emergency flashers does not excuse illegal parking.

The University of Arizona assumes no responsibility or liability for the care or protection of any vehicle or its contents while it is parked on University property. The University also assumes no responsibility or liability for the care or protection of any vehicle or its contents during its

removal or subsequent storage resulting from violations of these regulations. For the purposes of these regulations, any person doing business with the University or working within the University area but not subject to the Board of Regents Conditions of Service or the University Classified Staff System may be treated as an affiliated with the university for parking purposes. Parking or operating vehicles on campus is conclusive evidence of willingness to abide by these regulations. Please see THE UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA MOTOR VEHICLE PARKING & TRAFFIC REGULATIONS for answers to specific questions as well as a complete listing of rules, regulations and violations.

PLAY-OFF NOTIFICATION (CHAMPIONSHIP BRACKET)

League events will culminate in a single-elimination play-off. It is a team's responsibility to check the bulletin boards immediately following their last league game to see if they qualify for the playoffs. The staff will attempt to notify the team captains about play-offs when or if time permits. Teams should check the bulletin board each day during the playoffs to receive up-to-date information. Avoid possible miscommunication. Check the board!

PLAY-OFF PROCEDURES

1. Play-offs

- Each team will advance to the single elimination play-off. The play-offs will begin with an in league play-off to determine which teams from an individual league will advance to the championship bracket. NOTE: When applicable percentages for league standings are figured by dividing the number of games won by the number of games played. For computing tie games, a tie is valued as a half game won and a half game lost. The percentage of a team with 7 wins, 2 losses, and 1 tie is .750 (7.5 10). If your team enters a league late or switches leagues, you risk the possibility of not playing a full league schedule, so the amount of games played in the chosen league/level are the games that are factored in.
- While every possible attempt to reschedule games is made during league play, this may not be possible during the play-offs. Facility and time limitations may cause teams to play as many as four games in four days, or double headers to advance to the next round. Teams that make it to the play-off bracket must be ready to play any day/any time.

2. Tie Breaker (optional) The Tiebreaker Procedure is adopted from the National Invitational Flag Football Championships.

- If a two-way tie exists, it will be decided by who beat whom in head to head competition.
- If a three-way tie exists, the team that forfeited a game is dropped to the lowest possible spot among the three teams.
- Difference between total points scored versus total points allowed. For example:
- "A" defeated "B" 7-0, "B" defeated "C" 7-6, "C" defeated "A" 13-6. Thus team "C" finishes first, team "A" finishes second, team "B" finishes third.
- If two teams have the same point differential, then who beat whom in head to head play determines play-off placement.
- If all three teams have the same point differential, then the total points scored will determine play-off placement.
- If two teams have scored the same number of points, then who beat whom in head to head play will determine play-off placement.
- If all three teams have scored the same number of points, fewest points allowed will determine play-off placement.
- If two teams have allowed the same number of points, then who beat whom in head to head play will determine play-off placement.

POSTPONEMENTS

1. Rain Outs:

- Never assume that a game will be canceled merely because of rain. The Campus Recreation Staff has the sole responsibility for postponements in case of inclement weather.
- The factors, which will be considered are, field conditions, weather conditions, and participant safety.
- Call the Intramural Sports Office at 621-8723 or The Department of Campus Recreation at 621-4709 an hour before game time for postponement information.
- If games are postponed, the Intramural Sports Staff will reschedule them for alternate days and times (most often on Saturday or as doubleheaders). CAPTAINS are responsible for contacting the Intramural Sports Staff to confirm make-up days and times. If a team is unable to play on the makeup day, the game will be considered "no contest".
- Unfortunately there is no guarantee that all postponed league games will be played. If the program elects not to make up rainouts, then all teams involved will receive a win. In no case will a partial refund be provided. The benefit that teams receive is the win.
- Rainout games will be considered official if they are stopped at halftime or later for soccer and flag football, at the end of the fourth inning or later for softball, and if a team has eight points or more for ultimate.

- During the week (Monday-Thursday) the decision to postpone games will not be made until 2:00p.m.
- During the weekend the decision to postpone will be made on site.

2. Facility Conflicts

- Every effort is made to avoid facility conflicts. However, special events may occasionally result in Intramural Sports activities being postponed. The Intramural Sports Staff hopes everyone is understanding and cooperative in dealing with these situations and apologizes for any inconvenience they may cause.

PROTESTS

Protests, which are made, will be considered only if they directly affect the outcome of the game. Protests may not be based on an official's judgment or decision. They may only be based on rule interpretation or player eligibility. The Director or his/her designee reserve the right to decide on all rules and policy procedure situations that arise which may not be addressed in the sport specific rules, this handbook or any other program literature. Decisions regarding disciplinary actions may not be protested.

1. Rule Interpretation:

- If a team feels an Official has misinterpreted a rule, they must verbally lodge protest immediately after the play with the field Officials and ask for the Sports Assistant. All protests will be resolved on the field/court by the on-site Sports Assistant. Their decision is FINAL. The game will then continue as quickly as possible.

2. Player Eligibility:

- Protest must be lodged with the on-site Sports Assistant prior to the game or immediately upon doubt about a player's eligibility.
- The protester must give the staff a reason to doubt the player's eligibility.
- The player and his/her team captain will be notified of the situation.
- The person in question must show valid U of A or picture ID when requested or will automatically be ineligible and may cause the team to forfeit.
- The player can sit out the game or play and risk forfeiting the game.
- If the player chooses to play and is found to be ineligible, the game will be forfeited, the player will be suspended from further participation in that activity, and the team captain will be suspended for one game.
- If the player does not play and is found to be ineligible, the game result will stand and the player will be suspended from participation in that activity.
- In all questions of player eligibility, the protesting team must complete the Protest Form and submit it to the Sports Assistant at the time of the protest.
- The Intramural Sports Staff will make all rulings on player eligibility.

REFUNDS

The refund process usually takes 30-60 business days. Payments made by check will be refunded through the University Check Request System. The check will be sent directly to the participant. Payments made by VISA or MasterCard will be refunded via a credit to the card. In all cases the "original" cash register receipt and the Intramural Registration Form must be presented in order to obtain a refund. When a sport is officially cancelled by Intramural Sports a 100% refund will be given

RESCHEDULING

Since teams select the day and time they play and due to the large number of teams, the comparatively short playing season, and the crowded playing facilities, rescheduling will be kept to an absolute minimum. The fee for rescheduling a game is \$10.00. Arrangements for rescheduled games must be made and be finalized at least 24 HOURS prior to the scheduled contest. Teams that reschedule games on their own without notifying the Intramural Sports Program will receive an automatic loss on their team record (both teams).

The Team Captain requesting the reschedule should come to the Intramural Sports Office, in the Student Recreation Center and obtain the name and phone number of the opposing captain from the Intramural Sports Staff. Please bring ID to show proof that you are the listed Captain. If the teams determine a mutually agreeable time to reschedule, BOTH captains must MEET IN PERSON at the Intramural Sports Office.

Days and times for reschedules are available on first come, first serve basis. In certain instances it may be impossible to reschedule. If the opposing team does not agree to reschedule, the game will be played at the originally scheduled time or it will be default. The Intramural Staff reserves the right to decline any reschedule request. Please realize that sometimes it is impossible to reschedule play-off games. As stated in the League Sports Entry Agreement (signed by the team captain) teams must be ready to play on any day at any time during the play-offs. If your team plans to play for the championship, please plan in advance to play in the play-offs.

SHOES

Every participant is required to wear proper or appropriate footwear for play. For indoor activities they must be non-marking court shoes. For outdoor activities, cleats may be worn provided they have molded, all-rubber soles. Metal, metal tipped, hard plastic, or screw-in/removable cleats or spikes of any kind are not allowed. It is the discretion of the supervisory personnel to ban the use of any footwear he or she may deem hazardous to participants.
